From the Desk of Fr. Michael

This week 68 of my brother priests and I were on our annual Priest Retreat at Mt. Angel seminary. It was an opportunity in the words of the retreat Master, Fr. Dennis McManus, to rest, sleep, eat well, pray, visit, and allow the Holy Spirit to move our hearts and minds.

The theme of the retreat is “Conversations of Jesus.” In the opening conference he pointed out that as priests and I would include Catholics in general when we read the Sacred Scriptures especially the Gospels, we pass over the conversations and dialogue that Jesus has and immediately go to the action, i.e., miracles and healing. Of course, by doing this, we miss a lot of the depth of what is actually happening in these human exchanges. In his Biblical studies he has found a great resource from Jewish Rabbis who provide him the Jewish culture context, i.e., being able to see the passage through the lens of a Jewish reader

One insight he shared that illustrates this is St. Joseph’s dream in which the Angel Gabriel appeared to him assuring him to take a pregnant Mary into his home. In the passage, St. Joseph is identified as a righteous man. The Jewish rabbis pointed out that the word for “righteous” in Hebrew identifies him as being part of particular group of devout men who loved the Law of Moses to the point that by following the Mosaic Law there in lies their joy.

When St. Joseph hears the news from Mary that she is pregnant by the Holy Spirit, although he does not truly understand the mystery, as a righteous man, he in his own humanity ponders through how the Mosaic Law could be fulfilled. The Mosaic Law was clear that if Mary bearing a child that is not Joseph’s, she would be considered to be an adulteress and be subject to death by stoning.

In order to avoid this harsh judgment, St. Joseph realizes that the Law also provided that during the period of engagement and before the married wife was taken into the husband’s household, there was a grace period in which if the husband had second thoughts he could divorce her. And the consequence would be that he would subject himself to public shame of making a poor decision. He worked through the law to find a merciful and compassionate resolution.

Doesn’t this sound familiar? If we examine the conversations of Jesus, he, too has the same trait of taking a person’s messy situation and administering the law in a compassionate and merciful way. St. Joseph taught him this.

Needless to say, this insight was very eye opening for me as a priest, confessor, and canon lawyer as I now have a greater appreciation for St. Joseph and his spirituality as well as his work ethic. So before I enter a confessional or read a marriage case, I will begin to do so invoking St. Joseph’s intercession.
